OUR PHILOSOPHY

I believe that family portraits should be as meaningful as they are beautiful.

In today's busy world, it's easy to let time slip by without pausing to document the people who matter most. Our sessions are designed to create space for that pause, to celebrate your family just as you are, in this season of life.

Our approach combines gentle guidance with natural connection. I'll help with posing, wardrobe consultation, and location selection while also creating an environment where real emotion can shine through. Whether it's a playful smile, a loving glance, or a quiet cuddle, I aim to capture images that feel true to your family and timeless for generations to come.

I'm not just taking pictures. I'm telling your family's story—one beautiful frame at a time.

WHAT TO EXPECT

This isn't about stiff poses or forced smiles. It's about capturing your family's natural connection—those sweet, silly, in-between moments that reflect who you really are.

Sessions are ideally scheduled around soft, flattering light—typically in the late afternoon or evening (close to or during golden hour) but can be done any time of day. Low-sun provides a dreamy glow and gentle shadows that make images feel warm and timeless.

The Flow of the Session

Your session will be a mix of light direction and natural interaction. I'll guide you into beautiful light and meaningful compositions, then prompt relaxed, candid moments.

If you choose, you can bring along activities and do a more **documentary based session**. This session is more active and less camera-aware. It's up to you! whatever you decide, I'll move at your family's pace and capture everything that unfolds while providing light direction.

My job is to watch for and help create real emotion and connection, and to capture it naturally unfold.

Session Length

Mini sessions are 30 minutes and a typical session is 60 (though sometimes less for younger littles with a shorter attention span). This gives us plenty of time to settle in, get to know each other, and connect. It's enough time for genuine moments to emerge without anyone feeling rushed or overwhelmed. If I need to pause for snacks, snuggles, or a reset, that's part of the flow.



Preparing for Your Session

Embrace the Natural Setting. The beach offers a dynamic backdrop with its ever-changing light, textures, and sounds. Allow yourselves to engage with the environment—feel the sand beneath your feet, listen to the waves, and let the breeze tousle your hair.

Let Moments Unfold Naturally. There's no need to pose. Whether it's building sandcastles, chasing waves, or sharing a quiet moment, these unscripted interactions are the heart of documentary photography.

Prepare for the Elements.

- Sunscreen: Apply before the session and bring extra for reapplication.
- Hydration: Bring water to stay refreshed.
- Towels/blankets: Useful for drying off or sitting on the sand.
- Snacks: Light, non-messy snacks can keep kid energy levels up.



Preparing for Your Session

Set the Scene, Then Let Go. Parks are perfect for letting your family's personality shine. Come ready to explore, play, and wander. We'll follow your natural rhythm.

Go With the Flow. There's no pressure to stick to a plan. If your kids want to run wild, dig in the dirt, or pick every flower they see—that's the session. These real, joyful, chaotic moments are what make the story yours.

Pack Light, But Smart.

- Sunscreen and bug spray: Apply beforehand and bring along.
- Water: Stay hydrated—play is thirsty work.
- Wipes or napkins: Great for muddy hands or messy faces.
- A simple snack: Something easy to eat and not too sticky if energy dips.

Find your style

This guide is here to help you feel confident, prepared, and stress-free heading into your family photo session.

Whether you're dressing toddlers, coordinating colors, or just hoping everyone smiles at the same time, this will walk you through what to wear, what to bring, and how to make the most of our time together.

Remember:

it's not about perfection, it's about connection.

STYLE TIPS

- Avoid bright White. It can blow out in bright light or reflect too harshly.
- Avoid Solid Black. It can lose detail or feel too harsh in the outdoors.
- Avoid Neon or bright Colors. They
 Distract and pull focus from faces.
- Avoid Matching Outfits. Matching from head to toe can feel dated and overly uniform.
- Avoid Busy Patterns. Loud or largescale patterns can distract and distort on camera.
- Avoid Logos & Graphics. Bold logos, cartoon characters, or words draw focus away from connection.

- **Try** off-white, ivory, or cream for a softer, timeless look.
- Try charcoal, navy, or deep earth tones for depth and warmth.
- **Try e**arth tones, jewel tones, or soft pastels that flatter all skin tones.
- **Try** coordinating color palettes with variety in different textures and tones.
- Try to limit patterns to one person per group. Choose small florals, subtle stripes, or soft prints.
- **Try** solids, textured pieces in neutral or muted tones for a timeless look.









DETAILS

- ✓ Make sure your glasses are clean and glare-free.
- ✓ Avoid wide-brimmed hats that cast shadows on your face.
- ✓ Keep jewelry minimal to avoid distractions in the photos.
- ✓ Make sure nails are clean; neutral polish or bare nails is best.
- √ Stick to natural makeup and avoid heavy or reflective products.
- Style your hair naturally and so it won't need constant fixing.







Spring sessions are all about light, softness, and natural freshness.

Choose breathable, natural fabrics like cotton or linen that allow for ease and movement-especially for kids who like to run and explore.

Layers are key during this season, as the weather can change quickly. Think light cardigans, shawls, or denim jackets in complementary tones.

Soft pastels like blush, sage, sky blue, and lavender work beautifully with the season's greenery and blossoms, while warm neutrals like cream or oatmeal keep things timeless.







Summer is the season for golden light, sandy toes, and flowing fabrics.

Opt for lightweight materials like cotton, or linen that breathe well and move beautifully in the breeze.

Choose silhouettes that allow you to stay cool like flowy dresses, rolled sleeves, or short-sleeved button-ups.

Keep layering minimal to stay comfortable in the heat, and go for barefoot, sandals, or light footwear, especially for beach or grassy sessions.

If your session is at golden hour, bring a lightweight extra layer for the cooler temps as the sun goes down.







Fall is all about rich colors, texture, and cozy layering.

As the leaves change and the light softens, this is the perfect season for earth tones.

Think sweaters, long-sleeved dresses, boots, cardigans, and layered neutrals for a timeless, seasonal look.

Mix and match textures like denim, corduroy, knits, and flannel to add depth without overwhelming the frame.

Don't forget to dress in layers, especially for evening sessions, when temperatures can drop quickly.







Winter sessions have a quiet, cozy charm —but staying warm and looking polished is the goal.

Layers are essential: think wool coats, thick knits, scarves, and stylish boots that allow you to stay comfortable and still look great.

Add texture through your fabrics. Faux fur, ribbed knits, and chunky sweaters look cozy and photograph beautifully.

Avoid oversized winter gear that might hide faces or flatten your outfits. Choose jackets that match your outfits.

Stick with a cohesive palette and dress in layers that look intentional.









BABIES

Choose soft, breathable outfits like rompers and stretch sets.

Avoid stiff collars, tight elastics, or anything that rides up.

Layer with cardigans or tights for changing weather.

Bring a blanket for sitting, wipes, snacks, and a backup outfit.

Feed and nap baby before the session. Calm = smiley.

Let baby explore. Those curious looks make magic.

KIDS

Let them wear clothes they can run, sit, twirl, and play in.

Stick to soft textures, neutral tones, and simple patterns.

Avoid logos, neons, or itchy fabrics that cause fussing.

Clean shoes or barefoot—skip character shoes if possible.

Pack wipes, water, clean snacks, and a hairbrush.

Don't hype it up. Talk about it like an adventure,

Play > pose. Movement brings out the best moments.

PROP SUGGESTIONS

Family sessions are all about connection, storytelling, and capturing your family just as you are. You don't need props to create beautiful images, but bringing along a few meaningful or playful items can add an extra layer of fun, comfort, or personality to your session.

Whether it's something sentimental, something that keeps the kids engaged, or something that reflects a family tradition or season, the right prop can help tell your story in a natural, relaxed way.

Here are a few ideas to inspire you:

- A picnic basket setup
- Family quilt or heirloom blanket
- A letterboard
- Handmade signs
- Musical instruments
- Bubbles or Balloons (muted colors)
- · A vintage wagon or sled
- · Jump ropes, sidewalk chalk
- · Woven baskets with flowers
- A kite or hula hoops
- A beach bucket and shovel set
- Fishing pole (if by water)
- · Camping mugs or thermos
- A skateboard, bike, or scooter
- · A baby carrier or sling
